

The Essex County Council (Woodside Way, Great Dunmow) (50mph Speed Limit) Order 2014

The Essex County Council ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 84(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act hereby makes the following Order: -

1. No person shall cause any motor vehicle to proceed at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on that length of Woodside Way and the unnamed access road leading from Woodside Way to Sector 4, Great Dunmow in the District of Uttlesford as specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.
2. No speed limit imposed by this order applies to vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011 when used in accordance with regulation 3 (5) of those regulations.
3. The Essex County Council (Uttlesford) (50 Mile Per Hour Speed Limit) Order 2004 is hereby revoked in so far as it relates to the length of road specified in Schedule 2 of this Order.
4. This Order shall come into operation on 01 February 2014 and may be cited as The Essex County Council (Woodside Way, Great Dunmow) (50mph Speed Limit) Order 2014.

Schedule 1



Road	Description
Woodside Way, Great Dunmow	From a point approximately 200 metres north of its junction with the Woodlands Park Drive Roundabout north-eastwards for a distance of 1750 metres.
Unnnamed access road from Woodside Way to Sector 4	From its junction with Woodside Way south-eastwards for a distance of approximately 27 metres.

Schedule 2

Revocations – 50mph speed limit

Woodside Way – from a point approximately 200 metres north of Woodlands Roundabout off the A120 to a point approximately 1210 metres north of that point.
