**Sutton Road j/w Shoplands Road – Feasibility**. The Network Team has confirmed that a feasibility study can be undertaken to look into the installation of a mini roundabout and exploring other options: £10,000.

Zebra lighting upgrade in locations in Hockley, Hawkwell and Hullbridge Road, Rawreth. A feasibility study would ascertain the works required to improve pedestrian safety.
