NOTICE OF MAKING OF AN ORDER HIGHWAYS ACT 1980 ESSEX COUNTY COUNCIL PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2022 FOOTPATH 1 GOOD EASTER

On 8 September 2022 Essex County Council confirmed the above order made under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980. The effect of the order as confirmed as shown on the order map is to divert a part length of Footpath 1 Good Easter of unknown width shown by a bold continuous black line on the order map commencing where the boundary of Round Roblets connects to the public highway close to the junction of Mill Road and Clatterford End road running in a northerly direction along the driveway through the garden and grassland then in an easterly direction for a total distance of 236 metres to the point where the path connects to Footpath 2 Good Easter and continues unaffected, to an alternative route 2 metres in width shown by a bold broken black line on the order map commencing 14 metres to the east of the aforementioned boundary of Round Roblets and the public highway accessed via a gap to the east of an existing field gate running in a northerly direction along the field edge for a total distance of 226 metres to the aforementioned junction with Footpath 2 Good Easter where it continues unaffected.

The alternative route came into force on 6 October 2022 and the old route was stopped up with effect from 13 October 2022, but if a person aggrieved by the order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 10 November 2022 make an application to the High Court.
