**NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF AN ORDER
HIGHWAYS ACT 1980
ESSEX COUNTY COUNCIL
PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2022
FOOTPATH 4 TILLINGHAM**

On 24th June 2022 Essex County Council confirmed the above order made under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980.

The effect of the order is to divert part of Footpath 4 Tillingham of unknown width shown by a bold continuous black line on the Order Map, from its existing route through the garden of the property known as Thrashes or Threshers to an alternative route 2 meters wide running along an arable field headland close to the eastern and southern boundaries of the aforementioned property.

The documents can be made available for inspection 8.30am – 4.30pm Mon-Fri at Essex County Council E block reception, County Hall, Market Road, Chelmsford. Copies of the order and order map have also been sent to Tillingham Parish Council and Maldon District Council.

The alternative route comes into force on 22nd July 2022, and the old route shall be stopped up with effect from 29th July 2022 but if a person aggrieved by the order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 7th July 2022 make an application to the High Court.
