The Essex County Council (Various Roads, Maldon) (20mph Speed Limit) Order 202*

Notice is hereby given that the Essex County Council proposes to make the above permanent order under sections 82(2), 83(2), 84(1) and (2), Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984:

Notice is also given that 'The Essex County Council (Various Roads, Maldon) (Temporary 20MPH Speed Limit) Order 2020' made by Essex County Council, under s14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, has been continued in force for an additional 6 months with the consent of the Secretary of State for the Department for Transport until 13 July 2022 or until the permanent order has been approved, whichever is the earlier.

Effect of the order:

To Introduce a 20mph Speed Limit on the following lengths of road in the District of Maldon. The roads below had a temporary 20mph speed applied as part of the initial response to the Covid-19 pandemic and it is considered appropriate to make these permanent to promote active travel and encourage sustainable forms of transport. The current temporary 20mph Speed Limit Order will expire on 13th July 2022 at which time without a permanent Order being made the road will revert to the previous status of restricted road by virtue of street lighting (30mph):

High Street,	From a point 14 metres northeast from the junction of West

Market Hill,	From the junction with High Street for its entire length in a

Fullbridge Quay,	From its junction with Market Hill in an easterly direction to its
Maldon	junction with Chandlers Quay and Anchorage Hill its entire
	length.
Chandlers	From its junction with Anchorage Hill in an easterly direction for
Quay, Maldon	its entire length.
Anchorage Hill,	From the junction with Fullbridge Quay in a southerly direction
Maldon	for its entire length.
