

The Essex County Council (Childerditch Lane Bridge (No.1874) and Little Warley Hall Lane Bridge (No.1865), West Horndon) (3Tonne Weight Restriction) Order 202*

The Essex County Council (hereinafter referred to as “the Council”) in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (4), 3(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as “the Act”) (as amended) and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act, hereby make the following Order: -

1. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause any vehicle having a maximum permissible gross weight exceeding 3 tonnes to proceed along the length of roads specified in the Schedule to this Order.
2. The Council are satisfied that for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the roads to which the Order relates or any other road and for preventing damage to the road or to any buildings on or near it, it is requisite that Section 3(1) of the Act should not apply in relation to this Order.
3. This Order shall come into operation on ** ***** 202* and may be cited as The Essex County Council (Childerditch Lane Bridge (No.1874) and Little Warley Hall Lane Bridge (No.1865), West Horndon) (3Tonne Weight Restriction) Order 202*

To Implement: A ‘3 Tonne Structural Weight Limit’ Restriction

Road	Description
Childerditch Lane, West Horndon, Bridge (No.1874)	From a point approximately 10 metres north of Childerditch Lane Bridge to a point approximately 10 metres south of Childerditch Lane Bridge, approximately 35 metres.
Little Warley Hall Lane, West Horndon, Bridge (No.1865)	From a point approximately 10 metres north of Little Warley Hall Bridge to a point approximately 10 metres south of Little Warley Hall Bridge, approximately 36 metres.
