Braintree LHP Cycling Schemes

In January 2013 the Braintree LHP Members recommended the following two schemes.

- IT753 John Ray Park, Braintree Cycleway
 - o £100,000 contribution from the Braintree LHP
- IT754 Vernon Way to Blackwater Way, Braintree Cycleway
 £30,000 contribution from the Braintree LHP

In September 2013, both schemes were cancelled from the LHP programme and passed to Braintree District Council to deliver.

The Vernon Way to Blackwater Way scheme was delivered in November 2015. (Please see attached picture)

The Braintree LHP schemes have been programmed for delivery this financial year. However, the LHP members recommended £30,000 towards the scheme in 2013, would the Members be content to the contribution from the 2017/18 financial year's budget.

The John Ray Park scheme is currently in the process of going out to tender and I would appreciate the panel members views on whether they would also like to contribute the recommendation of £100,000 from the 2017/18 financial year's budget.

I would like to make the LHP members aware that the Braintree LHP budget is currently £407,789. However, I cannot confirm the 2017/18 financial year budget until it has been announced by ECC.

BRAINTREE DISTRICT COUNCIL WITH ESSEX COUNTY COUNCIL LOCAL HIGHWAY PANEL – 22nd SEPTEMBER 2016 APPROVED SCHEMES UPDATE

At the panel meetings in March and July the Braintree Members recommended \pm 197,000 following the budget amendments for the 2016/17 financial year. Since then officers have been working hard to set the programme for this financial year.

The programme consists of 100% of the 2016/17 capital budget (£407,789) and an additional amount to take into consideration some 'roll over' from last year. You will see from the Approved Schemes List that some dates will appear as 2017/18 financial year. This accounts for the schemes which don't form part of the 100%.

For this financial year the dates given will be in quarters until the road space has been booked and the start date has been confirmed.

The following table shows details of all the schemes which the Braintree LHP have recommended funding towards and are currently being progressed within the 2016/17 financial year.
