Peter Wright and Rob Macdonald explained that there are discussions currently being undertaken regarding this issue and will report back to the Panel once a decision has been agreed. VAS signs have 5 year warranty however it is feasible that signs funded through the LHP would need to be maintained through the LHP.	RM
	Panel requested that information is sent out regarding criteria for weight restrictions and 20mph roads and zones. Rob Macdonald explained that these would all need to be look at on an individual basis however Rob will send out the details and resend the Members Tool Kit.	RM
	Councillor Gili-Ross requested that ECC approach the Parish Councils in a view to getting the schemes grouped together, such as a parish safety plan to make it easier for Officers and the Panel and meaning these can all be looked at, at the same time. Cllr Gili-Ross explained that the Traffic Safety Plans should be undertaken by the Parish Councils and approved by the community.	RM
	Panel requested that once a speed survey has been undertaken could the Officers at ECC send the results to the relevant panel member for the area in order for them to see results and move forward with the high demand of requests for lower speed limits.	RM
	Panel members expressed concern that some of the schemes are not grouped together i.e. Grove Road, Tiptree. Could this all be grouped together so panel members are aware of what schemes are going forward for the whole road?	
	Cllr Lissimore raised a concern that some schemes were not showing on the scheme list, Rob Macdonald explained that this is because there are currently still approx. 20 schemes still awaiting validation and will be brought to the next panel meeting.	
	Cllr Higgins would like clarification on 'where does the cycle route strategy fit into the LHP.  AL confirmed that cycling schemes considered by the LHP are considered in relation to the Local Transport Plan as well as CBC's Cycling Supplementary Planning Document (SPD). Cycling schemes are considered in light of these key documents to ensure a policy fit alongside local desires and to ensure the best strategic cycling provision.	AL
	Cllr Higgins asked why we are not putting in halo crossings automatically? Peter Wright explained that these are not permissible as expensive and ongoing	

	maintenance costs; the national guidance is to use these on Casualty Reduction sites only.	
	Cllr Lissimore raised concerns that the schemes are taking a long time to be delivered; especially the easier schemes such as new barriers outside schools. Alan Lindsay explained that there are currently a high volume of schemes being undertaken across the whole of Essex.
