HIGHWAYS PANEL held at COUNCIL OFFICES LONDON ROAD SAFFRON WALDEN at 6pm on 4 APRIL 2016

PUBLIC SPEAKING

The Chairman welcomed the public to the meeting and invited Councillor McCarthy to speak about the footpath in Hempstead.

Councillor McCarthy began by thanking the Highways Panel for its support in constructing the footpath. Residents had attempted to get a footpath built for 40 years and the Panel had helped to realise the scheme.

The parts of the scheme which had been completed had been good but the path was not yet complete and had been delayed, partly due to legal issues. The unfinished section had left access to two properties in a poor state and visibility was still an issue at some points of the path which made safety a major concern.

He appreciated that the Panel had a limited budget, but urged the Panel to consider that the footpath was a big priority and allocate funding so that the scheme could be completed.

The Chairman thanked Councillor McCarthy for his comments and invited Councillor Martin to speak.

Councillor Martin thanked the Chairman for visiting the byway following the last meeting of the Panel. He then asked whether the Chairman was aware that the footpath was not being placed where the parish council and residents were led to believe. He also asked the Highways Liaison Officer when the speed surveys agreed at the previous meeting would take place and what progress had been made on creating a feedback system for the Highways Rangers.

In response the Highways Liaison Officer explained that funding would be allocated to fund speed surveys later in the meeting. The surveys could then

take place in the next couple of weeks. A feedback system for the Rangers was still being developed due to time constraints. It was likely that the feedback system would be self-service.

Councillor Walsh said that if the bridleway had moved without permission, this was an enforcement issue and the move would be challenged.

HP25 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies for absence were received from Councillor Mills.

HP26 ELECTION OF A CHAIRMAN AND VICE-CHAIRMAN

Councillor Walsh was nominated and duly elected as Chairman. Councillor Freeman was nominated and duly elected as Vice-Chairman.

HP27 MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 19 JANUARY 2016

The minutes were received and signed by the Chairman as a correct record.

HP28 UPDATE ON CAPITAL AND REVENUE SCHEMES APPROVED

The Highways Liaison Officer said that Uttlesford was in a unique position as only one of its schemes had not been delivered (the roundabout in Hatfield Heath.) It had also managed to spend its entire allocated budget which was not the case with a number of other panels.

HP29 POTENTIAL SCHEMES

The Highways Liaison Officer said that the Panel's total budget for the year was £472,000. Half of this was a result of match funding from the District Council. This meant the Panel's budget was significantly higher than many other panels in Essex.

Councillor Sell thanked Councillor Gooding for the work he had done ensuring the Panel retained the same level of capital funding for schemes that it had last year.

The Highways Liaison Manager stated that £4m of the funding which had been allocated to highways panels throughout the county had been reallocated to deal with footway and road repairs. A report detailing the works carried out would be brought to the Panel meeting in June.

The Highways Liaison Officer said the total value of the schemes on the potential schemes list was £802,000. It was recommended that 160% of the total budget was allocated.

The Panel considered the schemes on the Potential Scheme List.

(i) High Street, Hempstead – Completion of footway works - £70,000

Members agreed that the scheme should be progressed

(ii) Lodge Road/ Old Mead Road, Little Henham/ Newport railway bridge – Implementation of works following the study into signage - £67,500

The Highways Liaison Officer said that it was recommended that the Newport element of the scheme was progressed. The signage approaching the bridge was not currently correct and once it was changed would make crashing into the bridge a prosecutable offence. There was a possibility of Section 106 funding for the scheme

In response to a question by Councillor Gooding, the Highways Liaison Officer said the other parts of the scheme could be progressed if the Panel decided to do that.

Members agreed to progress with the Newport element of the scheme. The other elements would be put on the reserve list.

Councillor Barker asked whether it was possible for the District Council's Planning Committee to obtain Section 106 contributions for these sorts of schemes. In response, the Highways Liaison Manager said this was not currently possible, but a system was being developed to facilitate this.

(iii) Margaret Street, Thaxted – Realignment at junction with Weaverhead Lane - £17,500

Thaxted Parish Council had been presented with two options, one which cost £10,000 and one which would cost £17,500. They had indicated their preference for the £17,500 scheme.

Members agreed to fund the £17,500 option.

(iv) Safer Roads Schemes - £10,000

The £10,000 pot of money for schemes throughout Uttlesford was no longer required. Additionally, the engineer responsible for the three other schemes said there was no engineering solution for all of them.

Councillor Gooding asked whether the schemes should be the responsibility of the Highways Agency.

Councillor Lodge said that he would like to see the reports for the three casualty reduction schemes and asked whether the schemes could be revisited if considered necessary. The Highways Liaison Officer, in response, explained that the Panel could decide to revisit the schemes.

Members agreed to not fund the schemes.

(v) Feathers Hill, Hatfield Broad Oak – New 30mph VAS sign - £8,500

Members agreed to fund the scheme

(vi) Wicken Road, Clavering – New 30mph VAS sign - £8,500

Members agreed to not fund the scheme.

(vii) Various locations, Hatfield Broad – Reinstatement/protection of the grassed triangles at the junctions - £3,000

Members agreed to not fund the scheme.

(viii) Rickling Green Road, Quendon – 20mph limit in the vicinity of the primary school

Members agreed to not fund the scheme.

(ix) Rookery Lane, Wendens Ambo – Sign review in the vicinity of the level crossing - £3,000

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(x) Newport Road, Debden – Road realignment works - £77,000

Members agreed to put the scheme on the reserve funding list.

(xi) B1417 Braintree Road, Felsted – Feasibility study into measures on the approach to the old railway bridge - £5,000

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(xii) Bardfield Road, Thaxted – Feasibility study into improving existing traffic calming measures - £3,000

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(xiii) Main Road, Felsted – Request for a second VAS sign

Members agreed to put the scheme on the reserve funding list.

(xiv) Anso Road B1055, Hempstead – Feasibility study on the introduction of a weight limit on the road and reclassifying it down from a B road

Members agreed to put the scheme on the reserve funding list.

(xv) Various roads, White Roding – Speed Surveys

Members agreed to put the scheme on the reserve funding list.

(xvi) Belchams Lane junction with Cambridge Road, Quendon – Feasibility study to address concerns about visibility - £3,000

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(xvii) A1060, Leaden Roding – Small extension to 30mph speed limit - £7,000

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(xviii) Duck Street, Wendens Ambo – Implementation of a 20mph zone

The Highways Liaison Officer said a speed survey had been completed and although the road did meet the criteria for a 20mph speed limit, the average speed of traffic along the road was 17/18mph. It was therefore recommended to not proceed with the scheme.

Councillor Lodge noted that the road was very unusual. There were strong feelings from the parish council about the scheme as delivery drivers often broke the speed limit along the road.

Councillor Chambers said that although he understood the comments made by the Highways Liaison Officer the road became very narrow at points and a lower speed limit made sense. He agreed with the points made by Councillor Lodge.

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(xix) Church Street, Saffron Walden – Implementation of a 20mph limit

In response to Councillor Lodge, The Highways Liaison Officer said the road did meet the criteria for a 20mph zone, but there was nowhere suitable on the High Street to put signs so that drivers were aware they had re-entered a 30mph limit. She also said that Church Street fell within the older area of the town and extra signage would urbanise the street.

Following the comments by the Highways Liaison Officer, Councillor Chambers asked whether other traffic calming measures could be explored.

Councillors Freeman and Sell both endorsed the Highways Liaison Officer's comments about signage on the street.

Members agreed to not fund the scheme.

(xx) Finchingfield Road, Great Sampford – Signage and lining amendments in the vicinity of the school - £3,000

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(xxi) Duck Street, Little Easton - Introduction of speed limit of road

In response to a question by Councillor Freeman, the Highways Liaison Officer said extending the 30mph zone was not viable as the area was not built up enough. Drivers would drive to the conditions of the road. She would speak to colleagues about the speed limit.

Members agreed to not fund the scheme.

(xxii) High Easter – Extension to speed limit

Members agreed to not fund the scheme.

(xxiii) Entry points into Manuden – New gateway features to replace existing damaged structures - £10,000

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(xxiv) Thaxted Road, Debden – Creation of a formal layby at Smiths Green - £30,000

Members agreed to put the scheme on the reserve funding list.

(xxv) Debden Green crossroads – Feasibility study into realignment of the junction - £3,000

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(xxvi) Either end of Newport – VAS Signs

Members agreed to put the scheme on the reserve funding list subject to the completion of meeting the criteria from the speed assessments

(xxvii) Bury Water Lane – Assessment of existing zebra crossing

Members agreed to put the scheme on the reserve funding list.

(xxviii)Cambridge Road and London Road – Request to look at entrance points in the village to deter speeding

Members agreed to put the scheme on the reserve funding list.

(xxix) Ross Close, Saffron Walden – Amendments to existing traffic calming measures in the vicinity of Katherine Semar school - £25,000

In response to a point by Councillor Lodge, the Highways Liaison Officer said that a 20mph speed limit near the school would not be viable due to the shape of the road. It would not be clear to drivers why the speed limit had changed.

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(xxx) Hall Road, Elsenham – Feasibility study into the erection of signage to warn drivers to road narrowing - £3,000

Councillor Gooding said the parish council's concerns were mainly surrounding the narrowing of the road near the crown junction.

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(xxxi) Town Street, Thaxted – Implementations of works following the feasibility study in 2015 - £20,000

The Highways Liaison Officer said that Thaxted Parish Council needed to revaluate the option which was presented to them.

Members agreed to put the elements of the scheme related to bollards and line refreshing. The other elements would be placed on the reserve funding list.

(xxxii) Stortford Road, White Roding - 2 VAS Signs - £17,000

Members agreed to put the scheme on the reserve funding list.

(xxxiii)Slip Road off Chelmsford Road, Hatfield Heath – Feasibility study to look at improving pedestrian safety - £3,000

The Highways Liaison Officer said the parish council wanted to look at ways increasing parking width and improving pedestrian safety. There were some legal issues with some of the traffic islands as they were not all owned by Essex Highways.

Councillor Barker noted that there were currently a lot of issues with roads around Hatfield Heath and improvements needed to be looked. Additionally, the District Council's greenbelt review had still placed Hatfield Heath on the greenbelt. This means that there would be less development and fewer Section 106 contributions which could be spent on improving infrastructure.

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(xxxiv)Thaxted Road, Wimbish – Reduction in speed limit to 30mph – £7,000

Councillor Barker said that the 40mph speed limit was often not adhered to. This would still be the case with a 30 mph speed limit and people would drive to the conditions of the road. In response, the Highways Liaison Officer said a 40mph buffer would be in place to ease traffic into the 30mph zone.

Councillor Gooding noted that a number of residents had complained about speed. The scheme was similar to the reduction in the speed limit on Clavering Road, Wicken Bonhunt. There was now a request for VAS signs because traffic was not adhering to the 30mph speed limit.

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(xxxv) Walden Road, Hadstock – Installation of a VAS sign on the approach to the village - £8,500

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(xxxvi) Walden Road, Hadstock - Pedestrian road signage - £1,000

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(xxxvii) Dunmow Road, Great Easton – Permanent VAS signs to replace mobile VAS signs currently in operation - £17,000

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(xxxviii) Clavering Road, Wicken Bonhunt – Request for a VAS sign – £8,500

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(xxxix) Gaces Acre - Directional signage for car park - £1,500

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(xI) Park Road, Little Easton – Request to introduce speed limit

Members agreed to not fund the scheme

(xli) Uttlesford SLR sites – Signage review to reassess the 2011 SLR sites - £5,000

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(xlii) School Lane and Bury Water – Adding a footpath to link School Lane with the Southern part of Newport

Members agreed to put the scheme on the reserve funding list.

(xliii) Crix Green, Felsted – Possible extension to speed limit

Members agreed to put the scheme on the reserve funding list.

(xliv) Chelmsford Road, Barnston – Feasibility study into possible road widening - £3,000

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

The Highways Liaison Officer said that installation of the roundabout at Hatfield Heath had not been possible because utilities lines prevented works from taking

place. Discussions about moving utilities lines were taking place, but it now looked as though the scheme could cost in the region of £200,000.

It was agreed that the scheme would be put back onto the list of potential schemes.

Councillor Townsend left the meeting.

Members considered the walking schemes on the potential schemes list.

(i) Thaxted recreation – New footway across the recreation ground - £30,000

Members agreed to put the scheme on the reserve funding list.

(ii) Catons Lane, Saffron Walden – Design works for a footway linking the car park to the existing footpath on Little Walden Road - £3,000

Councillor Lodge said there was a possibility of Section 106 contributions for the footpath.

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(iii) Park Road, Little Easton – Section of footway outside the Almshouses - £15,000

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(iv) Ashdon Road, Saffron Walden – Installation of pedestrian build out - £20,000

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(v) Bury Water Lane and School Lane, Newport – Feasibility study to look at footway linking into the back of the school

There was a possibility of Section 106 contributions to help fund the scheme.

Members agreed to put the scheme on the reserve funding list.

(vi) Sampford Road, Thaxted – Feasibility study into completion of the footpath - £12,000

There was a possibility of Section 106 contributions to help fund the scheme.

Members agreed to put the scheme on the reserve funding list.

(vii) School Street, Great Chesterford – Extension of footway - £20,000

Members agreed to fund the scheme

(viii) Bran End, Stebbing – Installation of footway

Members agreed to put the scheme on the reserve funding list.

(ix) The Endway, Great Easton – Feasibility study into new footway - £3,000

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(x) Saffron Walden town centre – Pram crossing - £12,000

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

Members moved onto to consider the potential Public Rights of Way schemes.

(i) Byway 30 and 31 Debden and 36 Wimbish – Resurfacing of the network - £40,000

Members agreed to fund the scheme

(ii) Jacks Lane – Refurbishment of the byway - £32,000

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(iii) Byway 46-31, Badcocks Farm to Gatehouse Farm, Stebbing – Reinstatement of byway and winter closure - £50,000

Members agreed to fund the scheme.

(iv) Byway 46-34 between Lubberhedges Lane and Long Green Lane, Bardfield Sailing – Reinstatement of byway and winter closure - £35,000

Members agreed to put the scheme on the reserve funding list.

(v) Footpath 86 (Cinder Alley), Thaxted – Improvement of surface - £15,000

The scheme could potentially be funded through Section 106 contributions.

Members agreed to put the scheme on the reserve funding list.

The Highways Liaison Manager said that it was preferable that all the reserve money was allocated so that the rolling works programme could be completed. Members then considered the potential Passenger Transport schemes.

Councillor Chambers left the meeting.

(i) The Moors, The Street, Little Dunmow – Wooden shelter - £6,500

Members agreed to put the scheme on the reserve funding list.

(ii) Rowntree Way, Saffron Walden – Replacement of Adshel shelter with wooden shelter - £11,000

Members agreed to put the scheme on the reserve funding list.

(iii) High Street, Saffron Walden northbound – New shelter and RTPI unit - £15,500

Members agreed to put the scheme on the reserve funding list.

(iv) High Street, Saffron Walden southbound - RTPI unit - £9,500

Members agreed to put the scheme on the reserve funding list.

(v) The Red Lion, Great Sampford – Replacement wooden shelter - £8,500

Members agreed to put the scheme on the reserve funding list.

(vi) Howe Lane, Great Sampford – Replacement wooden shelter - £8,500

Members agreed to put the scheme on the reserve funding list.

The Highways Liaison Officer recommended that £5,000 was allocated to carry out speed surveys. Members agreed to allocate this funding.

In response to a question by Councillor Barker, the Highways Liaison Manager said the funding which was allocated for the mini-roundabout at Hatfield Heath had not been lost and was instead used to fund other schemes.

In response to point by Councillor Freeman, the Highways Liaison Officer she aware that the yellow lines outside the pharmacy in Thaxted needed to be refreshed. These works were initially going to be linked to the works on Town Street but this was no longer the case.

Councillor Davey then asked for an update on the weight limit scheme in Dunmow. The Highways Liaison Officer said that Great Dunmow Parish Council had been liaising with the Principal Transportation Co-ordinator about the scheme.

Councillor Gooding said that there was a variance in understanding between parish councils about how Section 106 funding could be used. More information needed to be given to parish clerks to help rectify this.
